Boston is known as "The Hub." Major highways link Boston to points throughout the Northeast, and Logan International Airport offers nonstop daily flights from more than 100 domestic and international destinations. Attendees flying into Boston can easily reach the city's center aboard the free Silver Line bus that picks up at each airport terminal en route to South Station.



Boston is compact and accessible. The MBTA (known locally as "The T") operates subway and bus routes throughout the city, with commuter rail and boat service rounding out its services. If you need charter transportation - buses, limousines, boats or yachts - Boston has every base covered. Duck and trolley tours are available for exciting excursions.

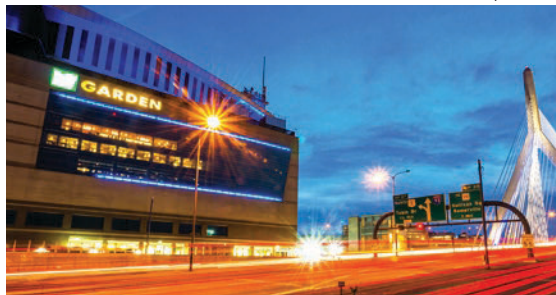
## Go Team!

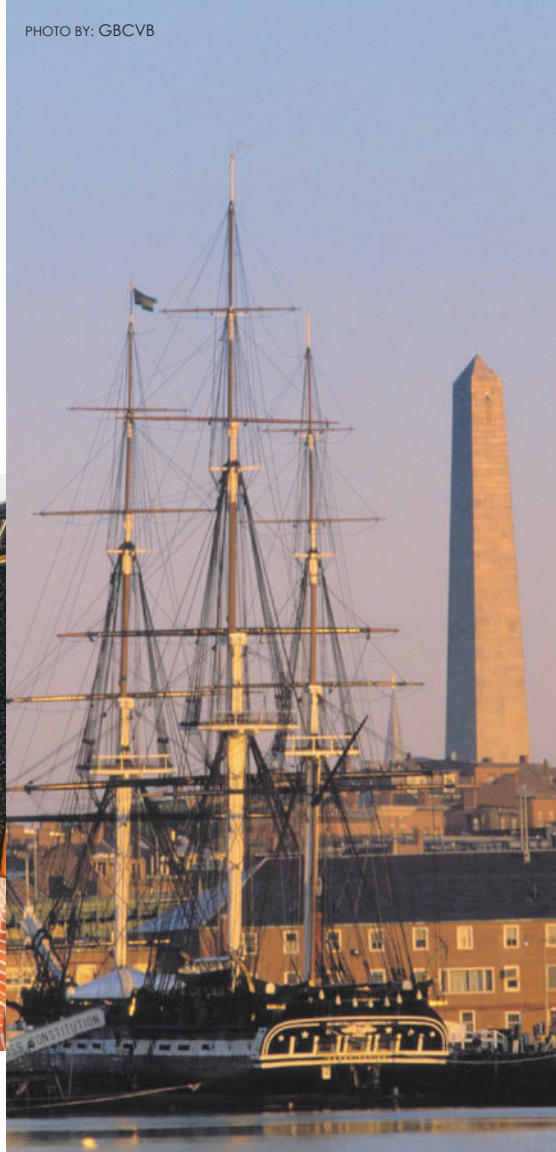

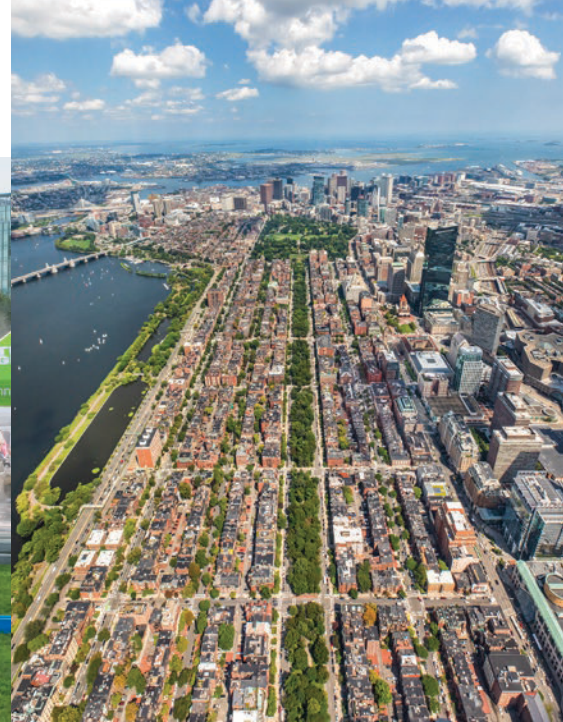


# Parks, Rivers and the Harbor, Oh My!
